

NEWS FROM OUR WICKLOW FARM

The past year has been busy at the IHWT. While we have seen a reduction in welfare calls and complaints to our office relating to equines we are still unable to meet the demand for care of stray and abandoned animals. This is such a sad reality. Even with the introduction of the new Animal Health & Welfare Act 2013 and Equine ID legislation, the message still does not seem to be getting through to many horse owners. There are still a lot of unwanted horses in the country, many of whom are welfare compromised. Indiscriminate breeding, especially in urban areas continues to be a problem and we have tried to target some of those equine black spots through our education courses and micro chipping clinics.

To date in 2017 we have taken in 10 equines. These horses where either stray,

abandoned or their welfare was at risk. So far this year through our fostering, re-homing and training programme we have helped 35 horses and ponies that were in our care. Due to the overwhelming amount of horses in the country we have decided to start re homing to Germany. More about this in the re-homing section below.

We currently have over 60 equines in our care of all types and ages.

We continue to look at more efficient ways of running the Charity. With the increase in printing and postage costs we are now moving to E-Newsletter for all future newsletters. EDUCATIONAL PROJECTS

EQUINE HOOF CARE COURSES

We ran another Equine Hoof Care Course with horse owners in Athy, Co Kildare. The course was delivered by Master Farrier Joe Tobin. This course has proven to be very successful. It enables us to build a good working relationship with horse owners while also teaching them an important skill. We found that the horse owners who attended this course had a very



good knowledge of hoof care and where keen to learn additional skills. Thanks to Kildare Traveller Action Ltd who where instrumental in the success of this course.

CASTRATION CLINICS

We ran a Castration Clinic for equines in the Fingals area in April and 9 stallions where castrated. We are currently working on running further castration clinics. Our aim is to try and find a solution to the level of indiscriminate breeding especially in the greater Dublin area. We are working with horse owners in various parts of Dublin and depending on the level of interests Castration Clinics will be run in several areas on a case by case basis.


DUNSINK HORSE CLUB

We ran a Six Week Horse Care Programme for the younger club members which commenced in August 2016. There was great attendance at this course and the younger club members learned all about basic horse care and management. Presentation day will take place in May or June 2017.



RECENT RESCUE STORIES

July 2016 - IHWT Lucy2 was surrendered over to the IHWT by her owner. She was in very poor body condition and suffering from a worm infestation. Her owner didn't have the means to care for her properly and agreed that she needed help. Lucy2 has now returned to good health and is doing well.






MORE RECENT RESCUE STORIES

August 2016 - IHWT Reanie came into the IHWT on welfare grounds after a member of the public reported a mare in distress to our office. She was suffering with third degree burns to her face caused by photo sensitivity. This was due to a reaction from the sun and a plant that she had eaten. She came into our equine centre with Linkin & Wilma. Sadly Linken was put to sleep as he was suffering from a neck injury and was in pain. Reanie and Wilma are both doing well. We would like to thank the Department Vet who authorised their seizure.





December 2016 - Our office received a call about a young horse straying on the road in a housing estate in the Arklow area. He was at risk of causing a road accident and no owner could be found. We liaised with local Gardai, and organised transport for him to be taken into our centre. The local residents had called him Paddy and he is a smashing horse and is doing very well, pictured right. We would like to thank the local Gardai for all their help in this case.

January 2017 - IHWT Hugie was found straying on the road in the Sallygap area. This is a very remote part of Wicklow and grazing at that time of the year was minimal. We think that Hughie was







dumped there, as there is no other reason why he would be in this area. With the help of Wicklow National Parks & Wildlife Service, Hughie was transported to our centre. Hughie was in poor body condition and was also suffering from a heavy worm & lice infestation. He also had a minor leg injury but has now made a full recovery. We would like to thank WNPWS for all their help in this rescue.

March 2017 - This was a joint operation with ISPCA. We received a complaint about an abandoned pony with hooves in terrible condition. He was left to graze on a site at the back of a small housing estate. This poor pony was in a lot of distress and was having difficulty standing. A donkey was also found at the site, and his hooves where also very overgrown. We had a vet attend the scene and pain relief was administered to the pony. Both where then transported to the IHWT where they received vet and farrier care. They are doing well and seem relieved to be in a safe place. We have called them Leon & Finn the donkey and both have travelled to the care of the ISPCA.







REHOMING

Due to the large volume of horses in Ireland we are now looking at re-homing outside of Ireland. We made a trip to Germany last summer to consider the possibility of re-homing there. We met with a volunteer group who have excellent equine knowledge that are trying to find suitable homes for Ireland's rescued horses and ponies. There is a big demand for Irish horses in Germany especially for coloured Cobs. These horses are very suitable for people looking for a good all rounder and also for families that are looking for a riding horse.

We spent a couple of days in Germany visiting homes where other rescues from Ireland had been successfully re-homed. All the homes that we visited had good facilities and the horses where much loved and had become a part of the family. We are now running a programme to re-home to Germany working with the volunteer group.

We plan to visit Germany in 2018 to visit some of the horses that we re-home there.

READY FOR RE-HOMING

IHWT Janie Mac is a 2010 13.2hh piebald Cob type mare. She was rescued in 2012 after been dumped in forestry land. When she came into our equine centre she was in poor body condition but thankfully she has made a full recovery. She is a beautiful Cob with a lot of potential. She is in work and has competed at local dressage shows. Janie Mac is a sensitive mare and would suit a lady rider who is interested in hacking, schooling and light dressage. This little Cob has a lot to offer.



IHWT Amber is a 2010 12.3hh liver chestnut pony mare. She came into the IHWT in 2014 after being dumped along with another pony. She is well handled and has a good temperament, but she can be a little nervous. Amber is unbroken to date but should go on to make a nice riding pony. She is a young pony and would need an experienced home.



IHWT Foley is a 2013 13hh chestnut gelding. He originally came into the IHWT as a welfare case as a yearling. He is unbroken and would need an experienced home. He has a lovely temperament and should make a lovely riding pony.



IHWT Ruby is a 2002 15.3hh dark bay Thoroughbred type mare. She came into the IHWT in 2012 as a welfare case with foal at foot. She is well handled but due to an injury would only be suitable as a companion horse and cannot be ridden. She has a lovely temperament and will make a lovely companion horse.



IHWT Jet is a 2012 black miniature pony with a wonderful temperament and is an ideal companion pony.

Details of The IHWT Thoroughbred Club Retired Racehorse Show Series

- Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height.
- Riders must be 16 years or over by Jan 1st in current year.
- Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle.
- Horses should be plaited.
- Winner and Reserve go forward to the Final /championship.
- All entries MUST have registered with The IHWT Thoroughbred Club (registration is free at www.ihwt.ie) and include their registration number on entry form.
- Horses must be retired and have RACED in a point to point or on the racetrack.
- All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the show Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'
- Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

- Prizes: Rosettes & TRI Vouchers 1st to 4th place. (Vouchers kindly supported by TRI Equestrian) Voucher values €75, €50, €30, €20
- Veteran Horse prize: voucher €25
- Champion and Reserve at the Final qualify for National Championships UK
- The Champion and Reserve from the Final /championship will also qualify for the Retraining of Racehorses (RoR) National Championship Show at Aintree, UK in August to compete in either the RoR Eilte Showing Series Final* or in The RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Final**.
- *To compete in the RoR Elite Showing Series Final, the horse must have raced in Great Britain. **If the horse has not run in GB, provided an amateur showing person rides him, he is eligible to go in the RoR Amateur Ridden Show series Final.

Costs of travel to Aintree and accommodation for horse, rider and groom is sponsored through the IHWT Thoroughbred Club.
