



## NEWS FROM OUR WICKLOW FARM

We are experiencing a harsh winter this year, with severe weather conditions in many parts of the country. This has seen an increase in welfare complaints to our office, with many horses being left wintering out with little or no access to sufficient forage.

This means there are a lot of horses that are in welfare compromised situations. We are liaising with ISPCA, Dept of Agriculture and local councils in many of these cases. Where necessary IHWT is providing forage and assisting with taking in the more serious animals who are suffering.

There continues to be a high level of unwanted equines in the country and this is putting pressure on our re-homing program. We are

finding it increasingly difficult to find suitable, long term homes for our rescues. We would urge horse owners looking to take on a new horse or pony to contact us first. Our aim is to match the right horse or pony to the right home. So please contact our office to see if we have something that will suit what you are looking for. We currently have almost 55 equines in our care of all types and ages.

In recent times we are focusing more and more on our education programmes (please see below for further details). We are seeing very positive results in equine welfare black spots where we have gone in and worked with horse owners on the ground. This includes education, clinics and horse projects.

IHWT is on the steering committee in the follow areas, Athy, Carlow and Dublin. In August the Dublin Region Horse Welfare task group was established to help tackle the huge problem of unregulated equines and the associated welfare problems. IHWT is part of this group and has signed up to the tasks groups to deal with education and indiscriminate breeding.

In 2015, leading animal welfare organisations (ISPCA, Dogs Trust, IHWT, Donkey Sanctuary, Irish Blue Cross and MADRA) along with representatives from the veterinary profession and websites advertising pets for sale joined forces to develop a set of minimum standards for websites to help protect the welfare of animals that are advertised online and ensure that any illegal activity is identified and investigated. The Irish Pet Advertising Advisory Group (IPAAG) was formed.

In November we attended the latest IPAAG meeting. IPAAG has been targeting unscrupulous breeders by reporting inappropriate online adverts in breach of the IPAAG minimum standards where they were acting illegally and compromising the welfare of innocent animals to make a quick profit.

Since its launch, IPAAG has used Google Ads to educate people searching for pets being advertised online. As a result over one million impressions and 22,485 clicks to the IPAAG website was reached specifically targeting people who were looking to source a pet online, but may not be aware of the risks or how to protect themselves from unscrupulous breeders. IHWT is committed to better monitoring of online sale of equines. Plans are being put in place to ensure better monitoring of online ads. PAAG is also going international with the launch of EU PAAG. We would like to thank Gain Equine Nutrition who continues to support the IHWT. Gain's support has been amazing over the past 5 years and it is because of this support that we have been able to help so many equines that are so desperately in need of help.

### **FDUCATIONAL PROJECTS**



#### **NEW ONLINE EDUCATION PROGRAMME**

The IHWT has developed a number of education courses in horse care and welfare aimed at horse owners from urban and disadvantaged areas. These courses cover all the essential areas of horse care, welfare and the management of equines so that participants are equipped with skills to care for their own equines and for employment within the horse industry in Ireland. Course content also covers legislation governing the keeping of equines. All of the core modules for equine care and management are delivered in sessions at the IHWT farm and at other locations. This includes sessions on sites where horse owners keep horses.

The IHWT has extended its education programme and has developed a 10 week online course which includes two full days of practical sessions. The course was launched at the ITBA Expo in Goffs on 26th & 27th January. The course is aimed at horse owners from disadvantaged areas and the travelling community and will act as a stepping stone to RACE, further education facilities and the equine industry.



#### **CASTRATION CLINICS**

In November we ran another Castration Clinic for equines in the Dublin area, 17 equines were castrated and micro-chipped. Many thanks to all those that attended and to our vets for all their hard work. There are plans for further Castration Clinics in 2018 depending on the level of interest and will be run on a case by case basis.

#### **DUNSINK HORSE CLUB**

The Dunsink Horse Club continues to work well and we are delighted to see one of the club members, Keith Dononhue, complete his training at RACE. Keith is now working full time in a racing yard. We are delighted to see Keith choose his career in the equine industry and look forward to hearing more about this talented young man.

In January 2018 club members visited Clondalkin Equine Club to see the facilities. DHC will be contacting local councillors to look for their support in securing better facilities including permanent stables and a small arena to help progress the project.

### RECENT RESCUE STORIES

December 2017 The IHWT was contacted by MLHR to assist with this case. These beautiful thoroughbred mares where found abandoned on woodland along with 5 others. They were left with no access to suitable forage or shelter. Thanks to MLHR who dealt with this case and ensured their safe removal with help of Department of Agriculture. Both mares, Issy and Abbie, are settling in well and happy to be in a safe place.

October 2017 Our cover star IHWT Spud was found abandoned on a local farmers land. No owner, no micro chip and no way of tracing where he came from. Spud was suffering from a severe worm infestation. Treating parasites can be very difficult and sometimes the damage done to the internal organs can be irreversible. He was treated by our vet and is getting stronger every day.

October 2017 IHWT Scout was found abandoned in the Wicklow area. Again no micro chip so no way of tracing the owner. He was very nervous and had a severe worm infestation. He is doing very well and gaining trust quickly. Scout and Spud have become best friends and they are great company for each other. Huge thanks to the person who found him and transported him to our equine centre.

**September 2017** IHWT Candy Sue and May May. Both came into our equine centre following on a complaint we received from member of the public. Both are aged and were in poor body condition.

August 2017 We assisted the ISPCA in rescuing this little fella following on a complaint about a young horse being kept at a disused site with no suitable access to forage or water. There was also a concern for the horses' safety as he was caught up in a long rope when we arrived at the scene. We had to cut him free and then find a way to get him out of the site, which was completely









enclosed. Thankfully this is a very brave horse and we were able to coax him up some steps and then load him safely. He is now safe & sound. He is an inquisitive horse and seems to be getting over his ordeal. We have called him IHWT Blue Boy. Thanks to the local Gardai for their help in this rescue.



## REHOMING UPDATES

IHWT Trotski and Phoenix showing what rescues can do, In September they entered the rescue horse class in the Royal Meath Show. IHWT Trotski came 2nd and IHWT Phoenix came 5th. We are so proud of them and so grateful to all those who offer a home to a rescued equine.

IHWT Nollaig is a 2013 piebald Cob gelding, height 13.1hh approx. He originally came into the IHWT as a welfare case. He is unbroken to date and would need an experienced home to bring him on. He is very well handled and has a lovely temperament and should go on to make a lovely riding Cob. This stunning Cob so deserves his own forever home.

IHWT Sarah is a 13.2hh 2010 bay pony mare. She originally came into the IHWT as a welfare case as a 2 year old. She is unbroken and would need an experienced home. She has a lovely temperament and should make a lovely riding pony.

IHWT Ruby is a 2002 dark bay Thoroughbred type mare. She came into the IHWT as a welfare case with foal at foot. She is well handled but due to an injury would only be suitable as a companion horse and cannot be ridden. She has a lovely temperament and will make a wonderful companion horse. This beautiful horse so deserves her own forever home

**IHWT Kyia** is a 2012 piebald Cob mare, height 13.3hh approx. Kyia is a stunning horse and has a lovely temperament. She would need an experienced home to bring her on but will make a lovely riding Cob. Please help Kyia find her own forever home.

IHWT Keano is a 2015 skewbald Cob gelding, height approx 12hh. He originally came into the IHWT as a welfare case in 2016. He was found dumped in the Wicklow area. Keano was in very poor body condition when he came into the IHWT and was suffering from a parasitic infection. However he made a full recovery. He has a lovely temperament and is very well handled. This little fella has such a great personality and we are hoping someone will fall in love with him. Contact our office for more details.









IHWT Hutch is a 2016 piebald Cob gelding, height 12.1hh approx to date. He originally came into the IHWT as a welfare case. He is well handled and would need an experienced home to build his confidence and bring him on. He has a lovely temperament and will make a lovely riding Cob.

IHWT Hughie was found straying on the road in the Sallygap area in January 2017. This is a very remote part of Wicklow and grazing at that time of the year was minimal. We think that Hughie was dumped there, as there is no other reason why he would be in this area. With the help of Wicklow National Parks & Wildlife Service, Hughie was transported to our centre. Hughie was in poor body condition and was also suffering from a heavy worm & lice infestation. He also had a minor leg injury but has now made a full recovery.

Hughie is now ready for re-homing. He is a 2016 skewbald Cob gelding, height 12hh approx to date He is still only young and would need an experienced home. He has a lovely temperament and should go one to become a smashing Cob.

IHWT Hal is a 2008 grey roan pony gelding, height 11hh approx. He was born at the IHWT from a rescue mare. He is unbroken and would need an experienced home. He has a lovely temperament and lots of character. Hal could make a lovely riding pony and we really want him to find his own forever home. IHWT Amber is a 2010 liver chestnut mare, height 12.3hh approx. She came into the IHWT in 2014 after being dumped along with another pony. She is well handled and has a good temperament, but she can be a little nervous. Amber is unbroken to date but should go on to make a nice riding pony. She is a young pony and would need an experienced home.

## IHWT THOROUGHBRED CLUB



In 2017 we ran the Retired Racehorse show series which was very kindly sponsored by Tattersalls and also supported by Godolphin and TRI Equestrian. The

final was held at Tattersalls Ireland in July. The Champion and reserve from the finals qualified for the Retraining of Racehorses (RoR) National Championship Show at Aintree, UK in August. We saw great support for this exciting show series with more people signing up to compete. It was lovely to see so many beautiful former racehorses competing at the ROR National Championship including many Irish bred.



2018 will see the continuation of the show series and the introduction of a new series of Working Hunter qualifiers for retired racehorses. The finals of these series will take place at Tattersalls Show on 21st July.

## TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP

It is now the policy of the IHWT to allow transfer of ownership of equines to Loaners after a 6 month period. We are writing to everyone that has taken out a Loan Agreement with the Irish Horse Welfare Trust (and have one of our equine (s) in their care for more than 6 months) to ask you to take the next step in horse ownership and take full ownership of your equine. 

# CHARITABLE DONATIONS SCHEME

If you have donated to the IHWT your gift may be dramatically increased simply by signing a form. If you donate €250 or more in one calendar year IHWT can claim tax back on your gift. This is at no extra cost to you. The tax refund for donations under Revenue's Charitable Donations Scheme applies to donors who are PAYE and Self Assessed.

Donors can sign the approved certificate/ form to cover qualifying donations over a five year period using the CHY3 enduring form or if they prefer for one year using the CHY4 annual form. In each case they are giving the charity permission to claim a tax refund on the donation/donations of €250 or more during the period covered by the form. Each form requires that the donor fills in their PPS number and signs the declaration form.

The Tax Relief amount we receive back is proportional to your donations; the higher your donations, the more tax we can claim back.

Thanks to the generosity of donors who have already donated to the IHWT. We can claim on donations over the past 4 years and would ask donors to contact our office for a CHY3 or CHY4 form
